Mónica García, MSW




Maria is a Faculty member at the University of Southern California (USC) Keck School of Medicine Primary Care

Administered by the TELACU Education Foundation, the College Success Program (Program) was created in 1983 to develop and empower new generations of leaders in the communities it serves. The Program is funded by TELACU and the generous contributions of our partners—corporations, colleges and universities, non-profit organizations and individuals—who have joined us over the past 30 years in advancing educational opportunities for our community.

The TELACU Education Foundation reserves the right to make the final selection of scholarship recipients based upon, but not limited to, the criteria described in these application guidelines.

More Than Just Financial Support

Faced with the new rigors of college life, the future leaders of our nation need more than just financial support during their collegiate years. To help ensure that TELACU Scholars make the successful transition from high school to college and, ultimately, into the workplace, the Program integrates four inseparable components: scholarships, seminars that focus on personal and professional development, ongoing advisement and guidance, and giving back to the community through volunteerism.

Through participation in the seminars, which is a required component of the Program, TELACU Scholars learn to successfully navigate the college experience through study skills and time management seminars, motivational exercises, counseling, and leadership development and training. Other elements of the Program include:

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must:

- Be a first-generation college student
- Be from a low-income family
- Have a minimum 2.5 GPA
- Be enrolled full-time for the entire 2013-2014 academic year
- Attend the mandatory seminars taking place on Saturdays throughout the academic year (Required only for students attending local area schools.)
- California Applicants: Be a permanent resident of an underserved community within the counties of Los Angeles, Orange, or San Bernardino, such as East Los Angeles, Boyle Heights, Baldwin Park, Bell Gardens, Commerce, Huntington Park, City of Los Angeles, Montebello, Ontario, Pico Rivera, Pomona, South Gate, Santa Ana, and San Bernardino
- Texas Applicants: Be a permanent resident of San Antonio, Austin, Laredo, Edinburg, or Rio Grande City
- Illinois Applicants: Be a permanent resident of the Greater Chicagoland Area
- New York Applicants: Be a permanent resident of the state of New York

Priority will be given to:

- Applicants majoring in the fields of Business and STEM-Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math. The Foundation prioritizes these disciplines to focus available resources on addressing the need for more professionals in these fields
- Applicants attending institutions that provide matching funds (listed on last page) and/or are located in Southern California
- Current College Success Program participants



Selection Criteria

A select pool of applicants will be invited to interview with the Scholarship Selection Committee, which consists of representatives from our community, corporate and educational partners. Candidates will be ranked according to their ability to demonstrate a combination of the following:

- Extracurricular involvement exhibiting a commitment to the community
- · Academic achievement
- A need for financial and academic support in order to successfully complete a post-secondary program
- Proven leadership within student, on-campus, or community organizations

Completed applications, together with all required documents, must be postmarked no later than March 22, 2013.

General Scholarship Information

Scholarship amounts range from \$500 to \$5,000, which include any matching funds from the college or university. Applicants entering college as a first-year student this fall are eligible to apply for a Scholarship that can be renewed for up to four years.

Criteria for Renewing a Scholarship

Scholars currently enrolled in the Program are eligible to renew their Scholarship if:

- · Maintained a minimum 2.75 GPA
- Attended school full-time for the entire academic year
- Attended all events and seminars conducted by the Program (Scholars attending school out of state or the local area are not required to attend)
- Volunteered a minimum of 20 hours of community service
- Plan to be enrolled full-time for the entire 2013-14 academic year
- Submit a renewal application and participate in a renewal interview
